Jeans for Genes day raises funds for Genetic Disorders UK. Money raised supports children throughout the UK that are affected by genetic disorders.

There are approximately 6,000 genetic disorders. It is estimated that one in 25 children are affected by a genetic disorder. 30,000 babies and children are newly diagnosed in the UK each year.
